

Chadash Brings Two New Programs to Its 2018/2019 School Year

As the 2018/2019 school year is quickly approaching, Chadash is pleased to announce two new programs to its Fall lineup. Both programs will enhance the already well established curriculum and are expected to bring fresh new energy to its students' learning.

Hebrew Through Movement

Hebrew through Movement, a program powered by the Jewish Education Center of Cleveland and developed by Dr. Lisa Schachter, a professor emeritus from Siegel College, is a language acquisition strategy in which students learn Hebrew by hearing and responding to Hebrew commands. The program is currently utilized by over 350 schools with over 1100 teachers enrolled in the online seminar training course. The curriculum for Hebrew Through Movement starts with a foundation in modern Hebrew, but in part-time educational settings has as its goal, making the prayers in our *siddur*, as well as synagogue and Jewish vocabulary, more easily accessible to those with limited learning time.

Chadash's Hebrew Through Movement classes will be taught in addition to the currently used *Mitkadem* program, but it will be taught during religious school hours by our beloved long-time Chadash Hebrew teacher, Laura Solomon, to our Torah Tots - 7th grade classes. We hope that our students will enjoy this new programming and that it will help them develop a life-long love of the Hebrew language that will instill a connection to Israel and to Judaism.

PJ Goes to School



PJ Goes to School (PJGtS), a companion program to PJ Library®, works with schools and educators across North America to bring Jewish values to life in their school communities. PJGtS offers a holistic approach to family engagement and Jewish education, triggering conversations about Jewish values in schools in the same way PJ Library inspires dialogue in the home. Like PJ Library®, PJGtS, is the mastermind of the Harold Grinspoon Foundation, and each participating school receives the following resources to use throughout the year.

- Monthly e-newsletters for Directors and Teachers.
- A selection of theme related books. (This year's theme is "Community and Taking Action)
- PJGtS tote bag
- A year of webinars for participating teachers.

Chadash was selected to participate in this program through an application process. The program is designed for students in Kindergarten -2^{nd} Grade and will be used to enhance our youngest classrooms' learning.

Rosh Hashanah is Coming!

Q. What is the meaning of the name "Rosh Hashanah?"

A. "Rosh Hashanah" means "Head of the year". Our sages explain, just as the "head" controls the entire body, how we act on Rosh Hashanah helps determine the coming year. In fact, everything that will happen during the coming year is decreed on Rosh Hashanah.

Q. Why do the Rabbi and Hazzan (and in many synagogues the congregation), wear a white robe (Kitel) on Rosh Hashanah & Yom Kippur?

A. White symbolizes cleanliness and purity. This reminds us of the words of the prophet, "Even if your sins will be as scarlet, they will become white like snow".

Another reason for the white garment, is to remind us of the shrouds worn on the day of death. Remembering this makes us realize that everything in this world is only temporary. This thought will bring us to repentance.

Q. What is the reason for dipping the hallah in honey?

A. This expresses our wish and trust that God will grant us a sweet year. Dipping the hallah and apple in honey is an expression of confidence that our merciful father in heaven, will grant us a sweet year.

Lulav and etrog sets will be \$54 each. It is possible to adopt an Etrog & Lulav or donate to the Etrog & Lulav Fund.




