Teaching Gratitude

With Thanksgiving upon us this month, it is a perfect opportunity to bring to mind the Jewish value of *Samayach B'chelko* or being happy with one's lot. In the Pirkei Avot 4:1, Ben Zoma said, "Who is rich? Those who are happy with their portion."

What does it mean, however, to be happy with what we have, and how do we pass along this message to our children? The concept of gratitude is challenging in a world built on consumerism with a constant feed of advertisements, blogs and social media posts in support of the hottest trends.

Teaching children the difference between wants and needs is a life-long pursuit, and at Chadash, our goal is to create the next generation of *menches* as they spend time with us each week. We try to instill the lessons of *Tikkun Olam* and a general care for others as the Torah teaches us to.

Notes for Hanukkah


Each night of Hanukkah, the procedure is to first light the Shammash (the candle distinguished from the other candles by its placement on the Hanukkiyah - Hanukkah Menorah). The Shammash is then used to light the appropriate number of candles, e.g. one the first night, two the second and so eight candles forth until (plus Shammash) are lit on the eighth and last night. Candles should be sufficient to burn for at least one-half hour after dark. The candles are placed in the Hanukkiyah from right to left – that is, the first candle is placed on the extreme right. The candles are then lit from left to right - that is, lighting the newest candle first.

Each night, after lighting the Shammash but before lighting the candles, two basic berakhot, blessings, are said: Barukh atah Adonai Eloheinu Melekh HaOlam, Asher Kidshanu B'mitzvotav V'tzivanu l'hadlik Ner Shel Hanukkah and then Barukh Atah

Adonai Eloheinu Melekh HaOlam SheAsah Nissim La'Avoteinu ba'Yamim haHem uva'Zman HaZeh. On the first night that candles are lit we add the sheHechiyanu - Barukh Atah Adonai Eloheinu Melekh SheHechivanu HaOlam v'Kivamanu v'Higiyanu laZman hazeh We place the Hanukkiyah in a place so that it is visible to passersby outside. While lighting, we recite HaNerot Halalu and then Maoz Tzur on page 242/111/308 (Sim Shalom / Sim Shalom For Shabbat / Sim Shalom for weekdays) of the Siddur.


On Shabbat (the sixth night this year) the *Hanukkiyah* is lit prior to Shabbat and before lighting Shabbat candles. For Saturday night, the seventh night, the prevailing custom is to light the *Hanukkiyah* before Havdalah in the synagogue, but in the home, immediately after.

November Shaliach Program

Learn about the Ethiopian Jewish Holiday of Sigd Wednesday, November 7, 7:00 p.m.

Our shaliach, Mor Roffe, will teach us about the Ethiopian Jewish holiday of Sigd. Sigd is a holiday of the Ethiopian Jewish community, known as "Beta Israel". The name of the holiday is derived from the Hebrew word for prostration, "sqida".

During Sigd, which is celebrated on the 29th of the Hebrew month of Heshvan - 50 days after Yom Kippur (similar to the holiday of Shavuot, celebrated 50 days after Passover), the community marks the renewal of the covenant between the Jewish people, God and His Torah. On Sigd, Ethiopian Jews pray to God and plead to return to Zion.



Today, since most members of the Ethiopian Jewish community have made Aliyah to the State of Israel, during the holiday, members of the community travel to Jerusalem and visit the Wailing Wall and the promenade in the city's "Armon Hanatziv" neighborhood. The holiday serves as an annual gathering of the entire Ethiopian community, and its members view it as an opportunity to strengthen the connection with their roots and culture.
